THE GOSPEL OF JESUS CHRIST God's Plan for Salvation

The Gospel of Jesus Christ is the most life changing message ever given to mankind. It is the good news that God has provided a way for sinners to be reconciled to Him through Jesus Christ.

Understanding this Gospel requires an exploration of God's holiness, humanity's fall into sin, and the redemptive work of Christ.

The Holiness of God

The foundation of the Gospel begins with the nature of God. The Bible says that God is holy, righteous, and perfect in all His ways.

"Holy, holy, holy, is Jehovah of Armies! The whole earth is full of his glory!" (Isaiah 6:3)

God's holiness reveals the severity of sin and the need for atonement. As a perfect Judge, He cannot overlook sin.

"You who have purer eyes than to see evil, and who cannot look on perversity." (Habakkuk 1:13)

The Fall of Man

Humanity's fall into sin is outlined in Genesis 3, where Adam and Eve disobeyed God. Through this act of rebellion, sin entered the world, bringing death and separation from God.

"All have sinned, and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

Because of sin, mankind is spiritually dead and unable to save itself.

"You were made alive when you were dead in transgressions and sins." (Ephesians 2:1)

This separation from God is the greatest tragedy mankind faces. Without a mediator, humanity is doomed to eternal separation from God.

God's Plan for Redemption

Despite humanity's rebellion, God in His mercy provided a path for salvation. This was foretold in the Old Testament through prophecies pointing to the coming of a Savior.

"He was pierced for our transgressions. He was crushed for our iniquities. The punishment that brought our peace was on him; and by his wounds we are healed." (Isaiah 53:5)

Jesus Christ, God's only begotten Son, entered the world to fulfill this promise.

"For God so loved the world, that he gave his only born Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish, but have eternal life." (John 3:16)

Jesus lived a sinless life, demonstrating perfect obedience to the Father. Through His teachings, miracles, and example, He revealed God's kingdom to the world.

The Atoning Work of Christ

The heart of the Gospel lies in the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. On the cross, Jesus bore the punishment for our sins.

"He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, that we, having died to sins, might live to righteousness. You were healed by his wounds." (1 Peter 2:24)

His death was the ultimate sacrifice, satisfying the wrath of God. Through His resurrection, He demonstrated His victory over sin and death. "But now Christ has been raised from the dead. First Steps for New Believers

For someone who is new to the Gospel and wants to begin their journey with Christ, the following are some foundational steps to get you started.

Recognize Your Need for Salvation

Understand that all have sinned and are in need of a Savior. "All have sinned, and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23) This awareness leads to humility and a sincere desire to seek God.

Repent of Your Sins

True repentance means turning away from sin and turning toward God. "Repent therefore, and turn again, that your sins may be blotted out, so that there may come times of refreshing from the presence of the Lord." (Acts 3:19) Ask God for forgiveness with a contrite heart.

♦ Believe in Jesus Christ

Trust in Jesus as your Savior and acknowledge His sacrifice for your sins. "Believe in the Lord Jesus Christ, and you will be saved, you and your household." (Acts 16:31) Faith is not just believing in His existence but trusting Him fully with your life.

Confess Your Faith

Publicly confess your faith in Jesus. "If you will confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved." (Romans 10:9) This confession shows your commitment to following Him.

Be Baptized

Baptism is an outward sign of the inward change brought by your faith in Christ. "Repent and be baptized, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." (Acts 2:38)

Pray and Read the Bible Daily

Prayer connects you to God, and the Bible reveals His will and guidance. Start with the Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John) to learn about Jesus' life and teachings.

Join a Faithful Christian Community

Find a faithful church or group of believers that aligns with sound biblical doctrine. Research denominations and sects to make sure they are teaching what the Bible says, and that they are not a dangerous religious group. We need fellowship because it strengthens our faith and offers guidance from more experienced Christians. Do not forsake "assembling together, as the custom of some is, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching." (Hebrews 10:25)

◆ Live Out Your Faith

Begin to live according to Christ's teachings. Strive to love others, serve those in need, and walk in holiness. "If anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old things have passed away. Behold, all things have become new." (2 Corinthians 5:17)

Trust in God's Grace

Growth in faith is a lifelong journey. Rely on God's grace to strengthen you as you face challenges. "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." (2 Corinthians 12:9)

Share the Good News

As you grow, share the Gospel with others so they may also experience God's salvation. "Go into all the world and preach the Good News to the whole creation. He who believes and is baptized will be saved; but he who disbelieves will be condemned." (Mark 16:15,16)
